Be sure to watch for information coming home soon!



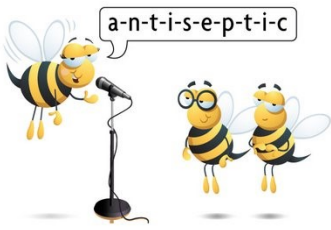
Cold Weather Reminders:
